SCPOA Standing Rule 11-001

Range Fees, Member and Non-Member use

Each year, the Board of Directors reviews the Range Fees. This includes, but not limited to, annual agency fee, annual membership fee and retired member lifetime and annual fee. Refer to attached fee schedule.

The Shasta County Peace Officers Association is a non-profit corporation and relies solely on membership fees for their income. The SCPOA pays insurance to cover any issues or accidents related to the use of the facilities. This insurance covers current members and guest(s) while being supervised by the member.

The SCPOA Board of Directors has voted to prohibit non-member use for any qualification or testing without membership or daily use fee.

Membership agencies historically have the exclusive use of the ranges and facilities without additional cost for agency training upon reservation.

Members and Retired members have the exclusive use of the range(s), unless reserved, without additional cost. Use of any additional facilities may result in some additional charges unless approved by the SCPOA Board of Directors.

Any use of the SCPOA Facilities by non-members will result in charges related to the approved annual rental fees.

Agencies historically pay for their employee membership fees for the use of the ranges and facilities for qualification, training or firearm practice. Annual membership fees can be paid by individual law enforcement officers their agency does not pay for the use of the ranges and facilities for qualification, training or firearm practice. Retired members have the option of paying an annual membership fee or lifetime fee for the use of the ranges and facilities for qualification, training or firearm practice.

Historically, the agencies use is scheduled in November of the preceding year. Agencies reservations have precedence over annual membership or retirement member use. Therefore, annual and retired members can use unscheduled dates and times or ranges not reserved.

All members have the exclusive use, except when reserved, of the range during normal hours of operation of 0700 hours to 2200 hours daily.

All members can invite non-member guest(s) for non-qualifying or testing range use. Members shall be present and supervise the non-members at all times while on the Shasta County Peace Officer Association property.

Large non-member groups may require Range master supervision. All large non-member groups should be approved by the SCPOA Board of Directors.

All non-member(s) use requiring a qualification or testing, of any nature, shall pay a daily use fee as described by the approved annual rental use fee schedule unless prior approval by the majority of the SCPOA Board of Directors.

Any unauthorized use of the range by a non-member for qualification or testing is prohibited and considered as trespassing.

Any unauthorized use of the range by a non-member, allowed by a membership agency or any member, for qualification or testing, is prohibited and considered a violation of SCPOA By-Laws, Section II: Members, Termination and Suspension of Membership, sub-section e and/or f.

Any unauthorized use of the range by a non-member, allowed by a membership agency or any member, for qualification or testing, will indemnify the non-member.

It is suggested each agency require proof of membership or paid daily use before qualifying or testing anyone to avoid violating membership terms.

Membership proof:

- Full time, peace officer employee of a membership agency (In good standing).
- Current Annual Membership Card (Membership cards are issued by calendar year).
- Lifetime Membership Card.
- Paid receipt issued by the SCPOA Board of Directors.

Monthly Dinner meeting can be attended by anyone.
